Celtic King

The Claddagh

The Claddagh is a unique Irish design symbolizing friendship, loyalty and love. The origin of the ring dates back to the 17th Century when Richard Joyce, a native of Galway City, was kidnapped into slavery on his way to the West Indies.

He eventually returned to his homeland and presented this ring that he crafted to his true love of before he was captured. While the Claddagh design is usually found on rings, it is now used all variety of items, including various pieces of jewelry and family crests.

The simplest of Celtic Knots symbolizing a triune God. The Celts were very familiar with the idea of the trinity, everything came in threes; the three stages of womanhood: maid, mother, crone, and the three elements: earth, fire, and water. Christianity embraced this knot to symbolize the Father, Son, and Holy Ghost in many of the early Christian illuminated manuscripts such as the Book of Kells.

The combination of the trinity knot into rings, linens, jewelry, and other bridal designs is associated with eternity and eternal love.

Celtic Cross

The Celtic cross may be the best known of all the early Christian symbols in Ireland. It is a popular belief that the Celtic cross was introduced to Ireland by St. Patrick when he was converting the pagan Irish.

It is believed that he emphasized the importance of the cross by combining the Christian symbol with the pagan symbol of the sun.
